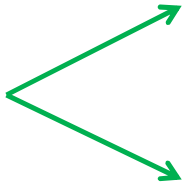
The granting of the four forks symbol means that it is an excellent mushroom which can be picked in large quantities and whose shelf life allows it to be marketed.

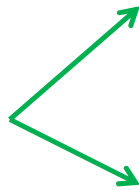

	It is the only chanterelle whose all parts of the fruitbodies range from orange-red to cinnabar red. Its whitish flesh is orange near the surface. It can be found from July to September in deciduous hardwood forests, particularly where oaks are present.
	Very small chanterelle whose fruitbodies come in two colors, yellow and orange. Its small size and color mean that it is often mistaken for an <i>Hygrophorus</i> . It fruits in deciduous to hardwood forests. Its flesh ranges from yellow to orange-yellow.
	When mature, the fruitbodies of this chanterelle are easily recognized by their inverted pyramid shape. It fruits mainly during the month of August in forests where coniferous trees are present.
	Found in the mosses of coniferous forests, this small gray chanterelle is distinguished by its depressed cap, umbonate in the center, and its forked false gills. Grayling fruits in late summer and autumn until the snow.
